



It is a Command To Grow

The Parable of the Talents



Matthew 25:14-30 is a story about a man who is going on a long journey. Before he left, he called his servants in and gave them talents or bags of gold to invest and grow. To one he gave 5 talents, to the second he gave 2, and to the last he gave 1. The first 2 servants immediately put their talents to work, while the last dug a hole in the ground and buried his away. When the master returned the first two servants were rewarded for putting their talents to good work, but the last servant lost his because he had hidden away what was given to him.

Grow- To develop, increase, use, or mature.
