**Base Verse: Acts 22:10 NLT** 

In Acts 22, Paul, formerly Saul, is attacked by a mob in Jerusalem and arrested for preaching about Jesus. As he was being taken to safety, he talked to the crowd in a way they could understand. He told them about his past, when he used to hurt people who believed in Jesus. Paul tells the story of how he changed on the road to Damascus. There, Jesus made him blind and asked him to stop doing bad things and follow Him. Paul had the choice to ignore Jesus, but he decided to listen. This choice changed his life completely. The story shows how God understands what we need and offers us salvation, guidance and love.



#### FIND SOMETHING IN COMMON WITH EVERYONE...

Finding common ground and sharing our story helps others see we're not so different. Paul spoke in a way people could understand and showed how he changed, helping others believe they can change too. Sharing our story builds trust and makes it easier for others to listen and follow the right path.





