I WILL NOT SIN! I WILL LIVE HOLY!

John 8:11 NLT

In John 8, some religious leaders caught a woman sinning and dragged her out in front of a crowd. They wanted to embarrass her and said she should be stoned—which means people would throw rocks at her until she died. They didn't care about helping her; they just wanted to trap Jesus and make Him look bad. Jesus responded by writing on the ground and told them that the one without sin should throw the first stone. One by one, the accusers left, recognizing that they too were sinners. Jesus then told the woman that no one condemned her and instructed her to "go and sin no more," encouraging her to stop change her life, stop sinning, and live for God.


